## SATURDAY, SEPTEMBER 21st

- *Transformative Solutions: Next Generation Technology and Global Youth Movements.* EDF, the UN Secretary General's office, the youth activist group <u>Student Energy</u>, and Mission Innovation are hosting a session on how technology can improve the environment. This panel will feature speakers from Google, technology start-ups, as well as EDF Europe Executive Director <u>Bryony Worthington</u> and EDF Senior Manager, EDF+Business Energy, <u>Isabel Mogstad</u> who will be speaking about our <u>Breathe London</u> project and <u>MethaneSAT</u>.
- *Carbon pricing*. The Carbon Pricing Leadership Coalition will launch the <u>High-Level Commission's Report on Carbon</u> <u>Pricing and Competitiveness</u>. The Commission is co-chaired by Feike Sijbesma, CEO of Royal DSM, and Anand Mahindra, Chairman, Mahindra Group. The Commission brings together private sector leaders and senior government officials to explore the evidence base, the concerns of business, and the lessons from carbon pricing systems across the world. EDF's <u>Nathaniel Keohane</u> and <u>Kelley Kizzier</u> were advisors to this report and are on the advisory Committee.

## S U N D AY, SEPTEMBER 22<sup>nd</sup>

• *Reducing deforestation.* EDF will co-organize two panels at the <u>Nature's Climate Hub</u> focusing on nature-based solutions to reduce deforestation. The <u>first event</u> will present two new initiatives - Emergent Forest Finance Accelerator and <u>Architecture for REDD+ Transactions</u> – seeking to develop a

new structure to scale finance for tropical forest protection. The <u>second event</u> features a discussion on corporate engagement in the <u>Produce, Conserve, Include strategy (PCI)</u>, an initiative designed to support sustainable and inclusive economic growth in the state of Mato Grosso, Brazil through 2030. Both events are open to the public.

## M O N D AY, SEPTEMBER 23rd

- <u>Carbon Removal Technology: A Must-Have for the Climate</u> hosted by EDF and the Aspen Institute. Keynote address from former U.S. Energy Secretary Ernest Moniz followed by a panel discussion moderated by EDF President <u>Fred Krupp</u>. The panel will feature leading policy experts, entrepreneurs and researchers.
- <u>Carbon Forum North America</u>. The International Emissions Trading Association's (IETA) annual regional forum for political, business and NGO leaders to discuss the latest developments, innovations and the outlook on climate action and leadership. EDF and iCAP are co-organizing the two-day conference (Sept. 24-25) at the Explorers Club, which will consider business-driven climate solutions, focusing on carbon policy, pricing, finance and innovation. EDF's president <u>Fred Krupp</u>, Senior Vice President <u>Nathaniel</u> <u>Keohane</u>, Associate Vice President <u>Kelley Kizzier</u>, and Chief Natural Resource Economist <u>Ruben Lubowski</u> will be on panels.
