

Methodology: This poll was conducted between July 30-August 1, 2020 among a national sample of 2200 Adults. The interviews were conducted online and the data were weighted to approximate a target sample of Adults based on gender, educational attainment, age, race, and region. Results from the full survey have a margin of error of plus or minus 2 percentage points.

Hurricane Season


52% of Black Americans and 49% of Latinos/Latinas say they are more worried about hurricane season this year amidst the pandemic.

Amid hurricane season this year, two thirds of adults view addressing climate change as a priority (66%).


Thinking about hurricane season this year, how much of a priority should it be for the U.S. to address climate change?



Hurricane Season

Climate change is a major concern regardless of education level. 70% of those holding college degrees and 63% of those without one rate addressing climate change as an important or top priority.



Half of adults in southeastern coastal states say they are more worried about hurricane season this year and two thirds say addressing climate change should be a priority.
